## Application for Membership

The Aviation Preservation Society of Scotland was formed in 1973 to bring together people interested in aviation matters and to carry out aviation-related projects.

Applicants will receive regular membership, but can also apply to become working members, if they have suitable skills and are able to give appreciable periods of time to supporting the Society's activities. Acceptance as a working member is not guaranteed and will depend on the number already in place, the type of work in hand and the particular skills a potential member has to offer. There is an (informal) interview and a probationary period.

Working days at the Museum of Flight are Wednesdays and Thursdays, typically from 10am to 4pm, with Wednesday being the best day for an exploratory visit. The Society endeavours to have someone on hand on both days to speak to potential members. Ask for Building 32.

Tasks undertaken have always varied widely, from moving and painting aircraft and equipment, to highly skilled engineering, woodworking and electronic projects. The History Section undertakes research and maintains the Society's reference materials.

Subscriptions cover the costs of these activities and others such as insurance, postage, tool and material purchase, membership of the B.A.P.C and the periodic publication of "Fortune Teller", our in-house magazine (the Editor is happy to consider articles for inclusion).

The Society holds membership details on a computer database for ease of administration, production of address labels and similar. Membership details are not available to anyone outside the Society and the NMS National Museum of Flight, at which it is based.

The subscription fee\* is currently £15 for both regular and working members. Both categories have voting rights. If you are a tax payer please ask us for a Gift Aid form, completion of which helps the Society financially at absolutely no cost or inconvenience to you.

\* Fees are payable on April 1. Members joining in January to March are deemed to have paid for the following year.
